- Encouragement for under-represented groups

#### **Methods:**


- Press releases

### Democratic Strength

After the primary, DSP team will calculate:

- Presidential preference at the global level (15% threshold)
- Number of delegates from each region (out of 9 total assigned to all three regions)
- Vote value for each Country Committee eligible to participate
