Welcome and Attendance

Quorum – Required in bylaws Bylaws: "for meetings of the Board, at least 6 members in attendance, of the Executive Committee, 3 members in attendance."

At start of meeting (5:30pm), quorum made with Board members (7) Devika, Kim, Elaine, Faith, Elleen, Justin, Elizabeth including (3) ExCom members Kim, Elaine, Elizabeth.

 - -Would like to hear Leadership's feedback
- Women's Caucus zoom call on Monday, Sunday had a brunch in Beijing.

LGBT Caucus

- New members added into the group by Jacob Flowers
- -active person wanting to help out with voting, and caucuses

Black Caucus

• -DA member Jasmine Cochran would like to help out in Guangzhou with registering voters, and maybe having a possible polling location

Future of the caucuses can focus on preparing for the primaries.

Aaron: YES. We will need help mobilizing members for the GPP. We cannot add official voting locations, but we definitely need to design a kit for voter support in various regions.

Action: Aaron will contact Nanjing volunteer and try to assemble a plan that can be used elsewhere.

5. Global Platform Committee and Kitchen Table Talks – Aaron reports that this has been very easy and fun. Suggests Terry and Jacob would be ideal hosts!

6. Open Floor

Devika shared a PPT by a Johns Hopkins scholar that he has used to present to his fellow students. Not an official DA training, but potentially useful format and can review.

Aaron wanted to address the recent removal of a person from the wechat group. This was done at his discretion but not at all in isolation. Lengthy discussion followed.

- Alexander is concerned that our handling of the wechat groups is driving away new people that might voice strong opinions.
- Faith is also concerned that adding new members to the wechat group (DA Chat)
 driving away new people because the chat doesn't represent our values and the
 intensity fo the debate.
- Alexander wants to make people be a member before they can be added. Aaron responds: We have tried... pros/cons.
- Faith points out that we have gone in circles on these issues since we started the groups.
- Alexander wants to volunteer to moderate and approve new members. Aaron: Hard to resolve without Elaine and Kim.
- Alexander points out we have different ideas about what is acceptible. Worried when we kick people out or call them worthless.
- Aaron asks for feedback from tow members on the call Terry and Jacob who have been very active on wechat. We cannot ... adjudicating content. Tone is important. Need people to think positive about the Democratic Pary.
- Terry: Been involved for a year or so. DA should we supportive of the party. And makes sense to keep it positive. Also, like Faith don't want to turn off new people.

ACTION: Aaron will create a sidebar to include Elaine and Kim in the conversation as well as all interested parties to decide on next steps.
