The Global Presidential Primary (GPP)

The Democrats Abroad Global Presidential Primary (GPP) will run from March 5 to March 12, 2024 at voting centers around the world to help select the next Democratic presidential candidate.

Democrats Abroad will send delegates to the Democratic National Convention (DNC) in August 2024 who reflect the results of our primary. These delegates are elected at our regional and global conventions next year.

- Voters must meet the following criteria to participate in our primary
 - Reside abroad and be a U.S. Citizen
 - Be a member of Democrats Abroad
 - Be 18 as of November 5, 2024
 - Not have voted, or plan to vote, in any other 2024 state presidential primary
- Besides in person voting, voters abroad may also vote by downloading a ballot and emailing, faxing, or postal mailing it to Democrats Abroad from February 13, 2024 through March 12, 2024.

GPP in 2020 - Facts & Figures

- Voters in 180 countries successfully cast their ballots
- 39,984 voters participated in the primary
- Voting took place at more than 230 voting centers across our country committees
 - List of 2020 voting centers
- The majority of voting events were held on Super Tuesday and the next weekend
- Voters cast their ballots in person, by email, fax, and postal mail
 - 2020 totals by ballot type

Country Committee info due Dec 31, 2023

- Voting Center manager name
- Name & address of local person who will send out mail-in ballots
- Name & address for local mail-in ballot deliveries
- Waiver requests

Voting Center Requirements/Suggestions

Required

- In-compliant country or transnational committees must run at least one (1) voting center
- Voting Centers must be run in a building that is not a private home

Suggested

- Chapters of in-compliant country or transnational committees are encouraged to set up at least one (1) voting center
- Country committees in formation as well as out-of-compliance committees are encouraged to set up at least one (1) voting center
- Not in a country committee? Consider running a Ballot Assistance Event!
 (2020 info here as a reference, but not a guideline)

Considerations for Choosing a Voting Center

- Location: Safety, public transportation, centrality, recognizability
- Timing: Ensure space is available at least an hour before and after voting
 - Triple confirm time and date, recommended in writing
- Size: Consider voter numbers <u>review past attendance as a guideline</u>
- Space needs: Voting area, ballot box, info stand, registration, etc (see sample voting center layout)
- Space options: Ask now if you can decorate ahead of the event
- Connection: Look for good internet connection + electricity
- Context: Bars are off limits for some voter populations, be mindful of your voters
- Insurance: Check if venue requires insurance policy/rider
- Accessibility: See next slide for accessibility reminders


Voting Center

official voting location for in-person voting, must be declared by Dec 31, 2023; includes ballot collection and tabulation; must be publicly accessible; must be publicized

Voting Center Accessibility Considerations*

- Handicapped parking spaces available (if applicable)?
- Easy access to public transportation?
- Venue open for voting over several hours (or days) to accommodate all DA voters?
- Venue has a disabled-friendly restroom(s)?
- Venue has a "family-friendly" restroom(s) such as having a baby-changing station?
- Take into consideration the amount of stairs, lack of elevator, sufficient ramp, etc. for elderly and disabled DA voters?
- Venue has a sufficient number of seats available for guests who may need a rest?
- Venue has sufficient lighting for DA voters to accurately read all the voting materials?
- Are there appropriate emergency exit procedures for DA voters with a disability (such as those in a wheelchair)?
- Venue have a First-Aid kit and defibrillator available?
- Is there drinking water available for older/dehydrated DA voters (especially if in a hot climate)?
- If it is raining/snowing during GPP hours, is there a "Caution: Wet Floor" and/or mop available to quickly clean up slippery floors?

GPP Costs and Contracts

- Expected Costs
 - In-person balloting materials
 - Decorations and swag
 - Voting center venue rental (if applicable)
 - Postal costs for shipping tabulated ballots to Int'l Chair
 - Advertisement (if any)
 - Vote-by-mail printing and delivery costs
- Budgets differ by committee
 - Review numbers from previous voting centers (either your own or comparably sized committee)
- Costs associated with each committee's voting center(s) must be paid by the committee
- Contracts must be signed in coordination with the Global Executive Committee

Voting Center Manager Responsibilities

- Opens and closes voting at the center
- Makes sure Voting Center rules are followed
- Responsible for the safety of ballots during voting & until posted to Int'l Chair
- Keeps tally of ballots each day; makes note of challenges and provisional ballots
- Ensure ballots are accurately tabulated
- Sends ballots to Int'l Chair w/ tabulation + other details
- Reports results to Int'l Chair or designees by phone & email immediately after tabulation
- Organizes and manages volunteers to help with the Voting Center
- If applicable, contacts embassy or local police to notify them of expected large crowds, other safety concerns

Voting Center Manager

responsible for maintaining voting center rules and guidelines and managing a voting center during the GPP

Other Volunteer Roles at the Voting Center

- Greeter (traffic controller)
- Voter registration assistant (join Democrats Abroad!)
- Voter verification assistants (2-3, checks membership & whether voted remotely)
- Ballot distributor and logger
- Ballot box watcher
- Dedicated adviser to resolve questions and disputes regarding the rules
- VFA assistant for registering to vote in the U.S.
- General voter help (including remote voting and interest in being a delegate)
- Media coordinator
- Tellers for vote tallying after close of voting

Depending on voter numbers, one volunteer may fulfill multiple roles.

Numbers of volunteers needed for tellers, etc increase with number of expected voters. All roles are suggestions only, with the exception of the **teller** positions, which are **required roles**

Status of the Delegate Selection Plan (DSP)

Democratic National Committee (DNC) Review

- DNC Rules & Bylaws Committee reviewed on Sept. 14 (see video)
- DSP declared conditionally compliant
- DSP currently being edited to take into account comments (due Oct 20)

Highlights of DNC comments

- Primary use of RCV to be removed
- Single vote proportional system used instead

Glossary

Ballot Assistance Event non-official voting event designed to assist voters in remote voting; no ballot collection or tabulation

Global Presidential Primary (GPP) our party-run primary that allows Democrats Abroad members living outside the United States to participate in the Democratic Presidential candidate nomination process

<u>Democratic National Committee (DNC)</u> organization within the Democratic Party responsible for supporting US Democratic Party candidates. Also responsible for organizing the Democratic National Convention every four years

Democratic National Convention (DNC) presidential nomination convention held every four years to officially nominate a Democratic candidate for President of the United States and define the Democratic party platform. Delegates attend from the 50 states, plus DC, the territories, and Democrats Abroad


