Dear Ms. Herron;

1. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and they <u>intend to return</u>, are they allowed to vote in state elections?

This is a difficult question because the two key elements point in different directions. Generally speaking, we would consider the residence as the place where an individual does intend to return. If a person happens to be abroad, (for example, for work, school, travel, missionary service,) but intends to return to some town in Connecticut once they are through and see themselves as a resident of that town, and thereby are not a resident elsewhere, they could vote in state elections. However, I am cautious about answering in the affirmative without knowing what the person in your hypothetical means when by saying that they are "residing" abroad. In other words, does the individual happen to be staying abroad or have they truly taken up residence?

2. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and their return is <u>uncertain</u>, are they allowed to vote in <u>state</u> elections?

No.

3. If a U.S. citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>state</u> elections?

No.

4. If a US citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>federal</u> elections?

Yes, but only if the last residence of a parent was a town in Connecticut.
