Subject: Overseas voting

Dear Sir/Madam,

I'm a volunteer helping US citizens, living overseas, vote in US elections. We want to make sure that <u>votefromabroad.org</u> provides accurate and up-to-date voting information. Would you please answer the following questions.

- 1. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and they <u>intend to return</u>, are they allowed to vote in <u>state</u> elections? A voter's intent to return is not a qualification for voting.
- 2. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and their return is <u>uncertain</u>, are they allowed to vote in <u>state</u> elections? A voter's intent to return is not a qualification for voting.
- 3. If a U.S. citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>state</u> elections? In order to vote in Montana under UOCAVA, an overseas voter must have resided in Montana prior to leaving the US.
- 4. If a US citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>federal</u> elections? In order to vote in Montana under UOCAVA, an overseas voter must have resided in Montana prior to leaving the US.
