Subject: Voting Overseas

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am not sure you received my previous e-mail but I really need your help. I'm a volunteer helping US citizens, living overseas, vote in US elections. We want to make sure that votefromabroad.org provides accurate and up-to-date voting information. Would you please answer the following questions.

- 1. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and they <u>intend to return</u>, are they allowed to vote in <u>state</u> elections? Yes
- 2. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and their <u>return is uncertain</u>, are they allowed to vote in <u>state</u> elections? Yes
- 3. If a U.S. citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>state</u> elections? Potentially: if they have not registered to vote in any other state of the United States, and have a parent registered to vote within this state, they can vote in one county in which either one of their parents is a registered voter (see Neb. Rev. Stat. §32-939[2][a]).
- 4. If a US citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>federal</u> elections? Potentially: if they have not registered to vote in any other state of the United States, and have a parent registered to vote within this state, then they can vote in one county in which either one of their parents is a registered voter (see Neb. Rev. Stat. §32-939[2][a]).
