Secretary Hargett reached out to me and requested I respond to your inquiry. The responses to your questions are as follows:

Q1. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and they <u>intend to return</u>, are they allowed to vote in <u>state</u> elections?

R1. Yes. To vote in Tennessee elections, an otherwise eligible voter would use the last address in Tennessee where the person established a residence before moving abroad.

Q2. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and their return is <u>uncertain</u>, are they allowed to vote in <u>state</u> elections?

R2. Yes. To vote in Tennessee elections, an otherwise eligible voter would use the last address in Tennessee where the person established a residence before moving abroad.

Q3. If a U.S. citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>state</u> elections?

R3. Yes. A U. S. citizen who has never resided in the United States and presumably was born abroad may register temporarily and vote using the last address in Tennessee where the person's parents would be eligible to temporarily register and vote in Tennessee elections.

Q4. If a US citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>federal</u> elections?

R4. Yes. To vote in federal elections, aU. S. citizen who has never resided in the United States and presumably was born abroad may register temporarily and vote using the last address in Tennessee where the person's parents would be eligible to temporarily register and vote.
