I am not sure if you received the e-mail I sent you in November. I tried to call you today but you were in a meeting. I'm a volunteer helping US citizens, living overseas, vote in US elections. We want to make sure that votefromabroad.org provides accurate and up-to-date voting information. Would you please answer the following questions.

- 1. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and they mark their FPCA <u>intend to return</u>, are they allowed to vote in **state** elections?
- 2. If a U.S. citizen is residing abroad and they mark their FPCA <u>return is uncertain</u>, are they allowed to vote in <u>state</u> elections?
- 3. If a U.S. citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in **state** elections?
- 4. If a US citizen has never resided in the United States, are they eligible to vote in <u>federal</u> elections?
