Hi,

I'm a volunteer with VoteFromAbroad--we help US citizens and military personnel living overseas when they have questions about voting when they live outside the US or US territories.

We are preparing emails to provide voting information for Wisconsin voters and we found some conflicting information that we'd like to confirm with your office:

• If a civilian overseas voter uses the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) to request a ballot and they send in their FPCA by Email or Fax, do they also need to Mail it in?

This requirement is set out on the Overseas Vote Foundation's website (https://www.overseasvotefoundation.org/ vote/svid.htm?submission=true&stateId=55) but I didn't see it listed on your website (https://elections.wi.gov/electionsvoting/voters/military-overseas) or on FVAP.gov (https://www.fvap.gov/guide/chapter2/wisconsin).

Thank you--we appreciate your help in getting accurate information out to overseas voters!
