- ➤ DA Caucuses can help us win in 2020 by mobilizing voters around the issues that matter to them most!












WHY CAUCUSES ARE KEY?



➤ In 2016, Almost half of registered voters were Non-Voters!




SPOTLIGHT ON NON-VOTERS

CAUCUS STRATEGY FOR 2020

Mobilizing Voters around our ISSUES by:

- 1. Using Identity Messaging
 - Persuasion through identification with specific issues
 - Make it personal-what do you have to loose/gain?
 - "Skin in the game" even overseas!
 - We support you!
- 2. Creating a pathway leading from awareness to conversion
 - Education (events and resources)
 - Media outreach (noise around our issues)

IDENTITY POLITICS: GOOD OR EVIL?



If you are a Caucus Leader, you will hear variations of:

- "I don't believe in Identity Politics"
- "Identity Politics does more harm than good"
- "I don't see myself in any of your groups"
- "We lost because we focused too much on minority issues"
- "But we're all on the same side, aren't we?"
- "I don't know what you Democrats stand for"
- "You and your Identity Politics are tearing us apart"

But also:

- "I believe in your Cause. Can I join your caucus without joining the Democratic Party?" (sometimes it's just hard to love that donkey)
- "I hate politics, but I care about/I want...."



IDENTITY POLITICS: GOOD OR EVIL?

Reality Check:

- **Everyone** has multiple identities, concerns, interests, issues
 - This is not threatening, but normal, useful to know.
 - We all tend to RANK them and change this ranking periodically.
- Republicans have made identity politics part of their strategy-
 - using every possible wedge issue to split us into "us" and "them"
 - leveraging white identity politics for electoral gain
- Dems don't have to be afraid of identity politics, but we must define our terms

IDENTITY POLITICS: GOOD OR EVIL?



Two kinds of Identity Politics: (like good and bad cholesterol)


Commonality (The Good kind)

- Empathy
- Large circle
- Shared experience
- Positive, Inclusive
- Intersectional

Common Enemy (The bad kind)

- Let's unite, stick together against-----THE OTHER!
- Zero-sum game: you get more means I /we get less.
- Divisive, polarizing
- Defensive reaction against group-based threats


The buyer's Journey:

Funnel through the Caucus


>Awareness:

- **➤** Country-level Caucus Chair/Representative
 - works with local, country and global leaders.
 - may be elected or appointed by CC ExCom.
- Caucus Representatives at the Chapter level
 - work with the Country-Level Caucus Chair/Rep.
- > DA members in countries without an official Country Committee
 - Can form a Caucus Group of their own with their own Caucus Representative
 - Regional and Global leaders can assist in the formation of these groups.
 - Possible pre-cursor to CC formation


