Democrats Abroad: The Basics



Democrats Abroad at a Glance

- Democrats Abroad represents the 9 million Americans abroad as the official state party of the Democratic Party
- Established in 1965, we have **Country Committees** in 52 countries and members in nearly every country across the globe
- We have representation at the DNC
- We conduct our own presidential primary
- We send delegates to the Democratic National Convention



Our Mission

- We inform US citizens abroad about their right to vote in U.S. elections
- We help US citizens request their absentee ballots
- We work to protect the right to vote for US citizens abroad
- We advocate on issues that uniquely affect US citizens abroad
- We build communities of like-minded US citizens around the world
- We help elect Democrats up and down the ballot



Alphabet Soup

- We use a LOT of acronyms in Democrats Abroad
- The late Stanley Grossman (past International Treasurer and DNC member) wrote a piece called "Alphabet Soup". This informal guide is one of the many parts of DA built on Stanley's legacy.

- DPCA = Democratic Party Committee Abroad
 - This is the official name of the governing committee of Democrats Abroad (DA). The DPCA is the group responsible for the mission of DA and it is distinct from each of the Country Committees and the full membership of Democrats Abroad. DPCA members are defined in the Charter Section 2.2 (roughly, the Chair and Vice-Chair of each Country Committee, the Voting Representatives of those CCs with large enough members, the elected officers of the DPCA, and the DNC members representing DA).
- EMEA = Europe, Middle East, and Africa
- AP = Asia Pacific
- RVC = Regional Vice Chair



- CC = Country Committee
 - Country Committees are constituent units of Democrats Abroad as defined by the DA Charter. We use the term so often that "CC" has become a very common acronym. Members of DA that don't live in countries served by CCs are served directly by their RVC.
- ExCom = Executive Committee
 - This is the elected leadership team at local (CC) and international levels. Some CCs refer to their leadership team as a Board.
- NEC = Nominations and Elections Committee
 - The NEC is a team of independent individuals not running for office who are responsible for local, regional, or global elections. They put out the call for nominations, collect names of and verify the eligibility of candidates, run the elections, certify results, and address any challenges to the process.



- DNC = Democratic National Committee
 - The Democratic National Committee is the formal governing body of the Democratic Party. It coordinates among state Democratic parties, Democratic candidates, and a variety of constituency groups. Democrats Abroad participates in the DNC via our elected 8 DNC members (6 elected as DNC members, plus our International Chair and International Vice Chair).



- GPP = Global Presidential Primary
 - As a state party, DA conducts it own presidential primary across the globe.
 Any member of DA may participate, whether in a CC or a non-CC.
- DSP = Delegate Selection Plan
 - The DSP is the comprehensive outline that DA prepares and submits to the DNC detailing all aspects of the GPP and how we will elect the DA delegates that we send to the Democratic National Convention. This plan must be approved by the DPCA.



Voter Registration and Voting Law

- VFA = Vote From Abroad
 - <u>www.votefromabroad.org</u> is the voter registration and absentee ballot request tool that DA has developed. It is a non-partisan site.
- GOTV = Get Out The Vote
 - This is a core mission of Democrats Abroad and the Democratic Party. For DA, this term covers voter's process from completing the FPCA, through sending back a completed ballot, to checking to verify that the ballot was counted.



Political Activities and Regulation

- FEC = Federal Election Commission
 - The FEC regulates the donations that the DPCA relies upon as well as the political activities of the DPCA including coordination (or the legally mandated lack thereof) with candidates, political action committees, and other parts of the Democratic Party such as state parties.
