

Fundamental principles: Robert's Rules of Order

- Every member of the meeting has the right to speak once on an idea (if they wish) before anyone may speak a second time.
- Every member of the meeting has the right to know what is going on at all times.
- Only urgent matters may interrupt someone who is speaking or break into a queue.
- The group discusses one idea at a time and makes a decision about that idea before going to the next idea. Any exception to this is extraordinary and requires a motion and a vote.
- Any deviation from the rules is an extraordinary decision, made by the whole group.
- Online adaptation for DA: queue, **handup, and a bit of grace
