New Business

- WI Meet the Candidate Events
 - June 18th & 22nd
 - Working on a question for the Wisconsin meet the candidates events. Going to share some info and hope to chat about it briefly on Tuesday. Please help me to restructure/approve the following lines of questioning (and thank you!):

My other line of questioning centers on disabled student treatment.

In March, disabled rights were quashed by the Wisconsin State Senate. (AB970, AB966) In May, the Wisconsin Dept of Public Instruction released new data pertaining to the treatment of students in public and alternative schools. It showed Wisconsin's disabled students have been disproportionately disciplined using 'last resort' methods to control student behavior. (Disabled students accounted for 84% of incidents using restraints, and 85% of incidents of isolation.) What do you plan doing to strengthen the Americans with Disabilities Act and to reinforce the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act

... if you become Senator of our great state?"

A little unsure which would be the best way to go. I'd like to try more targeted questions. Figured I'd see what you thought! We had one Senate candidate drop out. We're waiting on confirmation from the atty general, and will speak mainly to US Senate candidates.
