- The theme of this year's Congressional Black Caucus Foundation Annual Legislative Conference was "Advancing Our Purpose. Elevating Our Power". We need to align our work over the next 30 days and beyond to meet the challenge.
- Among this year's programs were: "Leveraging the Power of Black Women's Leadership In The Fight
 For Our Rights, Freedoms, Safety, Justice & Democracy." the session addressed how Black women
 drive Black political power and discussed findings from this year's BWR/ESSENCE Power of the
 Sister Vote Poll, which measures Black women's perspectives on policies that affect us.
- The 2022 Town Hall focused on carrying on the legacy and journey of Black political progress,
 lessons learned, and strategic partnerships to advance Black liberation
- Research published this year under the auspices of the CBCF covers issues such as Al and how it affects you (unintended consequences), the history of reparations in the U.S. Evanston, IL case study looking at how a current proposal there to enact restorative justice via housing assistance, the impact of the Dobbs decision on the Black maternal health crisis, and why student loan debt cancellation matters for our community (Black alumni endure the most negative impacts of student loan debt. While the average borrower owes almost \$40,000 in debt, Black borrowers owe an average of \$25,000 more than white borrowers.)
